2024 THANKSGIVING BASKETS: Gloria Dei wrapped up the 2024 Thanksgiving Baskets ministry with 33 families receiving holiday baskets that will help them fill their pantries and feed their families for several weeks. Some families are experiencing financial hardship due to chronic health issues. Your generous contributions will help ease the stress and concern that families are facing as they try to feed hungry mouths in their homes.

Delivery people commented that some parents were very emotional at the sight of all the food and essentials that were carried to their front doors! Gloria Dei served 57 adults and 89 children, totaling 146 people! We really took care of the babies.

Families received handmade winter hats, scarves, and dish cloths.

During the final ten days of the Thanksgiving baskets drive, we held 4 sorting days, had **94 volunteers** who logged **156 hours! On November 23 we had 38 people delivering baskets!!** It's a sight to behold when the bed of a truck packed full of food and essentials is on its way to an eagerly awaiting family! With a project of this magnitude, it takes many volunteers to get the job done, and you stepped up to the plate!

We have dozens of people to thank and have done our best to express our gratitude to you personally. No-one can match the dedication and willingness to help like Gloria Dei!! Thank you to Pastor Tabitha for the endless hours of calling schools and agencies, connecting with families, and for her unwavering support of this ministry. Thank you to Thrivent, Kurt at Festival Foods, Eric at Sturtevant & Associates, Tori at CENTURY 21 Ace Realty, and our very own Loopy Loomers. Thank you to the children who warmed our hearts as they carried the weekly donations to the altar on Sundays! Thank you to the many volunteers who supported this program in any way. We're already making plans for next year!

This year we asked the people who delivered food to the families' homes to provide feedback; it was heart-warming to hear the responses from our families:
